**ORDER (I) ISSUING A FINAL DECREE CLOSING THE CHAPTER 11 CASES;  
(II) CONSENSUALLY TERMINATING THE CLAIMS AND NOTICING AGENT'S  
SERVICES; AND (III) GRANTING RELATED RELIEF**

Upon the motion (the “**Motion**”)<sup>2</sup> of the Debtors for an order issuing a final decree and closing the Chapter 11 Cases; and this Court having jurisdiction over the Motion pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334; and this Court having found that this is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2); and this Court having found that venue of this proceeding and the Motion in this district is proper pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409; and this Court having found that the relief requested in the Motion is in the best interests of the Debtors and the estates; and this Court having found that the notice of the Motion and opportunity for a hearing on the Motion was appropriate and no other or further notice need be provided; and this Court having reviewed the Motion and any objections thereto; and this Court having determined that the legal and factual bases set forth in the Motion and at any hearing on the Motion establish just cause for the relief granted herein; and upon all of the proceedings had before this Court; and after due deliberation and sufficient cause appearing therefor;

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

1. The Motion is GRANTED as set forth herein.
2. Pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 350, and subject to the Court's continued retention of jurisdiction as provided for in the Combined Plan and Disclosure Statement and Confirmation Order, Case No. 24-11432 (CTG), Case No. 24-11433 (CTG), Case No. 24-11434 (CTG), Case No. 24-11435 (CTG), and Case No. 24-11436 (CTG) are hereby closed.
3. This Order is without prejudice to any party's right to apply to re-open the Chapter 11 Cases.
4. The employment of Stretto, Inc. ("**Stretto**") as the claims and noticing agent (in such capacity, the "**Claims and Noticing Agent**") in the above-captioned cases (the "**Chapter 11 Cases**") is terminated upon entry of this Order.
5. Stretto is released and discharged as the Claims and Noticing Agent and shall bear no further responsibility in the Chapter 11 Cases, except that Stretto shall comply with Local Rule 2002-1(f)(ix).
6. Within twenty-eight (28) days following entry of this Order, pursuant to Local Rule 2002-1(f)(ix), Stretto shall: (a) forward to the Clerk of the Court an electronic version of all imaged claims; (b) upload the creditor mailing list into CM/ECF; and (c) docket a final register of all claims filed in the Chapter 11 Cases.
7. In the event Stretto receives any claims or documents pertaining to the Chapter 11 Cases subsequent to the entry of this Order, Stretto shall transfer any such claims or other documents to the Debtors as soon as reasonably practicable.
8. Stretto may reduce the public case administration website to a static homepage, and in its discretion may opt to deactivate the website altogether.

9. Stretto shall keep electronic copies of all records until one (1) year (after which time Stretto may, but is not required to, destroy such records), and Stretto need not keep paper copies of such records.

10. Stretto may destroy (A) all excess copies of notices, pleadings, plan solicitation documents, customized envelopes, and other printed materials, and (B) all undeliverable and/or returned mail not previously destroyed.

11. Stretto shall be compensated by the Debtors' estates for the performance of services required hereunder in accordance with the terms of its retention order.

12. The Debtors shall not be required to comply with the requirements of Local Rule 2002-1(f)(viii) requiring direct public access to claims and the claims register at no charge.

13. The Debtors shall provide to the U.S. Trustee all quarterly reports not already filed, including reports for any partial quarter for a period of time prior to the date of entry of this Order, and timely pay any fees due to the U.S. Trustee pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1930, including fees for disbursements through the date of entry of this Order, even if for a partial quarter.

14. The Debtors and the Clerk are authorized and empowered, and may in their discretion and without further delay, take any action and perform any act necessary to implement and effectuate the terms of this Order.

15. The Court shall retain jurisdiction with respect to all matters arising from or related to the implementation and/or interpretation of this Order.
