

EXCLUSION REQUEST FORM

Kendrick Davis v. Clients on Demand, et al., No. 2:23cv10541

You need to ask to be excluded from the Class if:

- You want to bring your own lawsuit against Clients on Demand, LLC, or Russell Ruffino relating to the Clients on Demand eight-week program;
- You already have your own lawsuit against any of the Defendants asserting claims related to those at issue in this lawsuit and want to continue with it.
- You do not want to be part of the Class for any reason.

If you exclude yourself from the Class—which also means to remove yourself from the Class, and is sometimes called “opting-out” of the Class—you won’t get any money or benefits from this lawsuit even if the Plaintiff obtains them as a result of the trial or from any settlement (that may or may not be reached) between any or all of the Defendants and the Plaintiff. However, you may then be able to sue or continue to sue Defendants for claims related to those at issue in this lawsuit. If you exclude yourself, you will not be legally bound by the court’s judgments in this class action.

To ask to be excluded, you must send an “Exclusion Request” in the form of a letter sent by mail, stating that you want to be excluded from the Class in *Kendrick Davis. v. Clients on Demand, et al.* Be sure to include your name and address and to sign the letter. You must mail your Exclusion Request postmarked by **December 19, 2025**.
